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The English It Cleft

In English grammar, an "it"-cleft is a construction in which a single clause has been split into two sections, each with its own verb. Also called a cleft sentence. An it -cleft begins with nonreferential it (the "cleft pronoun "), which is typically followed by a copula (i.e., a form of the verb be), a noun phrase, and a relative clause.

The word "cleft" means divided or split. A cleft sentence is a sentence in which some part is moved from its normal position into a different place to give it more emphasis. For example, instead of saying: Joe ate the cake.

Cleft Sentences - Really Learn English

In English grammar, a cleft is a construction in which some element in a sentence is moved from its normal position into a separate clause to give it greater emphasis. A cleft is also known as a cleft sentence, a cleft construction, and a cleft clause. "A cleft sentence is a sentence that is cleft (split) so as to put the focus on one part of it.

Definition and Examples of Cleft Sentences

Abstract English it-clefts are thought to be exhaustive (e.g. Chomsky 1977, Atlas & Levinson 1981, Percus 1997, É. Kiss 1998, Krifka 2008, Szabolcsi 1981, Zimmermann & Onea 2011), such that in a sentence like It was John who left, John is the only one who left.

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In English, a cleft sentence can be constructed as follows: it + conjugated form of to be + X + subordinate clause. where it is a cleft pronoun and X is usually a noun phrase (although it can also be a prepositional phrase, and in some cases an adjectival or adverbial phrase).
